

Day 29. Pray for revival in the land and that people everywhere will seek the Lord. (Isaiah 58:2; Jeremiah 32:38-40; Daniel 2:20-21)

Day 30. Pray that our leaders will appoint Godly individuals to positions of authority to bring our nation back from the brink of destruction and to return to “One Nation under God.” (Psalm 106:47; Isaiah 11:2-3)

Day 31. Now is not the time to give up. Pray for strength and courage. (Matthew 14:27; Ecclesiastes 10:2; Romans 13:11)

Day 32. Our God promises to walk with us. Let us pray with a renewed fervor and passion to see Him change our world through His church. (Isaiah 40:8)

Day 33. Pray for someone by name today and ask God to allow you to help them see His desire for our nation. Ask for the ability to share without argument but in love. (Proverbs 27:17; 1 John 3:1)

Day 34. One week until the election. Have I been faithful in lifting up my nation before the Lord? Do I need to dedicate more time today on behalf of America? Let me redouble my efforts. (Matthew 23:23; Galatians 5:22)

Day 35. Pray that the minds and the hearts of God’s people will be sensitive to His will. (Psalm 139:23-24; Romans 12:1-2)

Day 36. Agree with God today that Christians must stand in the gap to prevent evil from flourishing and you will be the one. (Ezekiel 22:30; Job 42:10)

Day 37. Pray that God will place individuals in leadership who will abolish abortion and restore the sanctity of marriage. (Psalm 139:13; Ephesians 5:31)

Day 38. Pray we remember that everything God does is for our good and His glory (Romans 8:28)

Day 39. Thank God that ultimately, regardless of the election outcome, His people win. (Psalm 37:10-11)

Day 40. Pray that God’s will be done and that He may be glorified through this election. (Isaiah 40:5; Matthew 6:10)

40 Days of Prayer for our Nation

Beginning September 24th through November 3rd, 2020

Instructions: This is only a guide. Pray in your own words and use the scriptures as a way for God to speak to you. The Bible says in James 5:16 (NIV) “Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective.” We need healing as a nation so let us pray without ceasing. (1 Thessalonians 5:17)

Day 1. Pray that God will move in each of us to seek His will for the United States of America and turn our nation back to the Biblical principles on which it was founded. (Revelation 2:5; 2 Chronicles 7:14) Pray eyes will be opened to see the hope to which we are called. (Ephesians 1:18).

Day 2. Pray that each eligible person will vote and remember that our vote matters. Thank God for allowing us to live in a free country and for the privilege to vote for our earthly leaders. Remind us daily of the price many paid and continue to pay for our freedoms. Repent and seek forgiveness for taking our freedom and right to vote for granted in the past. (Proverbs 14:34)

Day 3. Pray for God to show us how to be positively involved in carrying out our Biblical convictions in this election process and to help us become better educated on candidates and to be compassionate citizens in helping to restore unity and purpose for America. Help us to speak with love and Godly wisdom in regard to the issues of education, business, health care, marriage and family, abortion, welfare, energy, government and taxes, military, terrorism, international relations, and every challenge that we will face in the years to come. (Isaiah 32:8)

Day 4. Pray that individuals running for office to put serving others ahead of selfish purposes and prevent those running for office from making campaign promises they cannot fulfill. Uphold the dignity of each person involved in the political process and help us to remember that all have been created in the image of God. (Genesis 1:26, 27; 1 John 1:9)

Day 5. Thank the Lord for the Godly politicians who are currently serving and for the Legislators, Executives, and Judges who do not know God, that He would call them to Himself. Remind Believers that personal transformation is more important than transfer of political power and that the elected official’s eternal destiny is more important than who is in office or a change of law. (Proverbs 2:21; 1 Timothy 2:1-2)

Day 6. Pray for the protection and the integrity of the voting process including registration and participation. Protect the vote counting process. Help each individual involved in the process to be a person of integrity. (Daniel 6:1-4; Psalm 25:21)

Day 7. Pray for each candidate to know and remember that it is not by personal might, power, ability, or fundraising that they will be victorious and successful in leadership. It is only by God's Spirit and His sovereign will that people are given the opportunity and ability to lead others. Protect the candidates, their families and the campaign workers from physical, emotional and spiritual attacks and harm. Help each individual to grow closer to God through the campaign. Protect them from becoming corrupted by the power they acquire by being in office. (Proverbs 2:10-12; Zechariah 4:6; Matthew 6:33)

Day 8. Pray that the Lord will place individuals in office who fulfill God's sovereign purpose. (Romans 13:1-7)

Day 9. Pray that God will give us elected officials who, with discernment, will write, enact and enforce laws that bring Him glory. (Psalm 58:1)

Day 10. Pray that God will keep evil and destructive forces from influencing the election. (1 Peter 5:8; 2 Corinthians 10:4)

Day 11. Pray for the "main-stream media." Make integrity the word and principle that best describes media efforts while covering the campaign. Guide the media in their endorsements of candidates. (Psalm 7:8)

Day 12. Pray the Lord will help each of us to hear only the truth and help guide public and private election discussions to be free from lies, spin, and rumors. (John 14:15-17)

Day 13. May we be reminded that Jesus died for all people and it is God's heart that all would come to know Him as Savior. (1 Timothy 2:4) Let us pray for the lost. (Luke 19:10; 2 Peter 3:9)

Day 14. Ask God to prevent further outbreaks of violence and acts of terrorism during the campaign that are aimed at disrupting and destroying our political process. (Isaiah 60:18; Psalm 12:7)

Day 15. Pray for protection and strengthening of the marriages of those running for office and the marriages of their campaign workers. Keep all individuals sexually pure in their thoughts and actions. (Hebrews 13:4)

Day 16. Pray to remember that our hope and trust is not in the election results but in God alone. (Romans 15:13)

Day 17. May our elected officials seek Godly council now and forever. (Proverbs 11:14)

Day 18. Pray that churches around our country will proclaim God's Word to direct our nation in selecting a leader. (Proverbs 1:23; Ephesians 3:10-11)

Day 19. Pray that all who claim to know Christ will seek His guidance with a humble spirit in the bond of peace (Micah 6:8; James 1:5; Ephesians 4:3)

Day 20. Pray for Americans to do what is right in the eyes of God and for the good of the country (2 Chronicles 20:32; Acts 26:18)

Day 21. Ask God to expose the unrighteous acts of the candidates and for us to see them clearly. (Proverbs 2:22; Luke 12:2; 1 Corinthians 4:5)

Day 22. Pray that Christians will remain faithful to the task at hand for the benefit of the next generation. (Psalm 37:4.; Isaiah 49:22, Habakkuk 3:2,19)

Day 23. Ask the Lord to remove the scales from the eyes of those who listen to rhetoric rather than reason (Luke 23:34; Proverbs 3:5-6)

Day 24. Pray that Christians will speak the truth in love in the political arena as well as all areas of life. (Proverbs 12:22; Ephesians 4:15, 31-32; 1 Peter 2:15)

Day 25. May we be reminded of the confidence we have in asking God according to His will. (1 John 5:14-15)

Day 26. Pray that the economic situation will be addressed by good stewardship of our government as directed by the citizens of the United States. (Ecclesiastes 12:13-14; Luke 16:10; Romans 14:12)

Day 27. Ask God to give you boldness and proclaiming the Word to those who need to hear it that they may have a changed heart and make a wise decision in selecting our leadership. (Isaiah 55:11; Hebrews 4:12)

Day 28. Pray that confusion will be replaced by Godly clarity in the minds of the American people. (1 Corinthians 14:33)
